CHIROPRACTORS CONTINUE PROVIDING ESSENTIAL HEALTHCARE IN KEEPING WITH GOVERNORS ORDERS IN GEORGIA

Marietta, Georgia, March 25, 2020— Georgia Council of Chiropractic (GCC) affirms at this time that chiropractors in the state of Georgia are able to continue providing care for their patients and communities in keeping with Georgia Governor Brian Kemp's Executive Order on Monday. The GCC was encouraged to see that the Governor continued to keep businesses, including chiropractors, open in spite of increasing pressure to close down the state. The Governor did, however issue an Executive Order limiting large gatherings statewide, ordering "shelter in place" for certain persons, and closing bars and nightclubs for 14 days.

The Governor stated "at minimum, this order for isolation, quarantine, or shelter in place covers those who live in a long-term care facility, have chronic lung disease, are undergoing cancer treatment, have a positive COVID-19 test, **are suspected to have COVID-19 because of their symptoms and exposure, or have been exposed to someone who has COVID-19.**"

The order also bans "...all gatherings of ten or more people unless you can maintain at least six feet between people at all times." And further states, "The Department of Public Health will be empowered to close any business, establishment, non-profit, or organization for noncompliance." The order went into effect at noon Tuesday, March 24, 2020 and expires at noon on Monday, April 6, 2020.

While the Governors orders are for the entire state, we do know certain counties and cities have enacted more stringent orders for their districts. A list of those order can be found here as featured on WSBTV.com.

We would like to reassure Georgia's citizens that chiropractors will continue to provide essential chiropractic care during this time in keeping with the Governors orders. Offices will enact policies to either limit the number of persons to less than ten or to maintain the social distancing of no less than 6 feet apart. These measures are in addition to already observing CDC guidelines.
